## Cooking is for the Birds: by Kay Green Losh



It's summer, it's HOT!!, and it's time for some cool, light meals. We tend to eat simple meals at this time of the year, or *eat out!* It's a good time to try any salad ideas you've collected, do simple top-of -thestove meals so as not to heat up the coach, or your kitchen.

Here's something I'm making for dinner tonight; it has all the best parts of a good BLT, and couldn't be simpler. **BLT SALAD and LEMON-BASIL MAYO DRESSING** 



Dressing: <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Cup light mayo 1 tsp. freshly grated lemon zest

- 2 T. lemon juice
- 1 T. water
- 1 T. finely chopped fresh basil leaves

Mix in a small bowl, and add ground pepper to taste.

Salad: 8 Cups sliced Romaine lettuce

 $1 \frac{1}{2}$  pounds fresh tomatoes, sliced from top to bottom (you lose less juice from them this way)

8 slices cooked bacon

Arrange lettuce on a large platter, cover with slices of tomato, and sprinkle with a little salt. Drizzle half the dressing over the salad, add crumbled bacon to the top of the salad. Pass the remainder of the dressing when serving.

If any of you are lucky enough to be spending time near the coast, or if you can find fresh crab meat in your local store, this is a great recipe for fresh crab cakes. If you're not so lucky--like me--you could use frozen or canned crab in this recipe.

### CRAB CAKES WITH BUTTERMILK-BASIL DRESSING

1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> pounds lump crab meat

1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cups fresh bread crumbs

2 T mayo, + more if needed

1 large egg white

1/2 lemon, juiced

sea salt and freshly ground pepper

Mix all ingredients and form into 6 large cakes. Put the cakes on a plate, cover loosely, and put in the refrigerator to chill.

For dressing: Combine all these ingredients in a blender. It

should be the consistency of a classic ranch dressing when finished. It should be served at room temperature, so pull it out of the refrigerator about 15 minutes before serving.

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup buttermilk

- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup mayo
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup fresh basil leaves
- 2 T extra-virgin olive oil

a few drops of lemon juice

sea salt to taste

<u>To cook the crab cakes:</u> Remove from the refrigerator. Heat 3 T olive oil in a large sauté pan over medium heat. Add the crab cakes, and cook about 4 minutes on each side until they are nice and crisp.

To serve, spoon some dressing on the plate and place the crab cake in the center.

Consider one evening with a multi-salad supper. Make your favorite version of Tuna or Chicken Salad, a garden salad with all the wonderful fresh veggies added, and perhaps some fresh fruit chopped into a salad, all arranged on a pretty (paper!) plate. Most of this can be prepared early in the day, and pulled from the fridge for a cool supper. Keep your cool, drink lots of water, and remember those awful days last winter!

It's August and it's hot! Time for some cool lunches, and side dishes. I don't know about you, but I don't stand over the stove a lot at this time of the year, nor do I have the oven on for a long time.



We had people over the other day and did a "cold lunch" with pasta salad, green salad, chicken salad with dried cranberries added, and a cheese and deli meat tray. With the other relishes, I put out these Pickled Beets. This is simple to prepare, can be made ahead and all but 1 of my kids like these a lot. In fact, my son asked that I make him a dozen jars for Christmas this year!

**Easy Pickled Beets** 



Drain 2 cans of canned beets, and set aside.

 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup vinegar

- $^{1\!/_{\!2}}$  cup juice from the canned beets
- 2-3 whole cloves
- 3-4 peppercorns
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 small bay leaf

Mix all these in a small pan, and bring to a boil. Add a spoonful of sugar or honey if you like sweeter pickles. Pour over the drained beets in a glass jar or stainless steel bowl and let set overnight. If you like, you can add a few thin slices of onion. (Don't put these in your good plastic, because it will get indelibly stained.)

Since we're all having a lot of salad on these hot days, here are some salad dressings that make a tasty change.

### **Celery Sour Cream Dressing**

### Into <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup sour cream, stir

 $\frac{1}{4}$  cup minced onion

1 T vinegar

1 tsp celery seeds

¾ t salt

Mix well and keep well chilled.

I've made this Tomato Salad Dressing for years and my family really likes it. It seems most appealing to me in the summer for some reason.

#### **Tomato Salad Dressing**

3 T corn syrup

Rich Ducci: Chairman

- 2 t dry mustard
- 1 t salt

1 t paprika

 $\frac{1}{2}$  t pepper

1 can condensed tomato soup, undiluted

1/2 can vinegar (1/2 cup plus 2 T)

1/2 can salad oil (1/2 cup plus 2 T)

2 T minced onion

In a jar or bowl, combine syrup, mustard, salt, paprika, and pepper; add the rest of the ingredients; shake or whisk until well mixed; refrigerate. Shake before using. Makes about 2 & 2/3 cups.

It started in the sewing room, progressed to the fishing tackle and fly tying stations then even further in this day and age packaging removal, then became a tool of great importance

in the kitchen. What tool? Oh the Scissors of course. I tired of scrounging around the drawers looking for this tool while having one hand full of something that could not be put down and the other hand wet of course. After telling Charolette of this dilemma. she marched off to a garage sale and on her return, I was



expected to see in my Grandmothers kitchen, so proudly mounted to the wall, just like the old safety wooden match drawers with strikers, needed to light the stove.

This not being a good thing, I opted to add an off and on switch with a red led indicator light added to the switch/plug plate. For 110vac power, I tapped into the circuit that the original Konstant hot was plugged into and ran a new Romex 2 wire with ground to a

We have enjoyed an abundant crop of delicious peaches this year here in Peach Country! I hope you are staying cool, and send best wishes to each of you for fun and safe travels.





# Wanderlodge Plant Update: Submitted by Brenda Rodgers

Recent information condensed from an article in the "Leader Tribune" newspaper in Fort Valley, Georgia:

"TATSA" (Tecnologia Avanzada en Transporte S.A.) a bus manufacturer based in Argentina purchased the Wanderlodge factory and its remaining equipment many months ago. TATSA builds a line of buses for mass transit with customers in South America, Europe and Asia.

The U.S. economic downturn and slow recovery left cities, counties and transit authorities without much money for major new purchases so the plant opening and the jobs that go with it are on hold.

Signs bearing the "TATSA" logo have recently been placed on the building.

According to Fort Valley Mayor John Stumbo who keeps in touch with TATSA officials, the company is waiting for better market conditions before scheduling a ribbon cutting and hiring workers.

TATSA's product line includes several sizes of mass transit buses equipped with diesel engines. One model has an articu-

lated body which is longer than most other urban buses with a flexible mid-section.

TATSA recently announced an alliance with U.S. based Eaton Corporation using Eaton's hybrid diesel-electric technology.

TATSA and Eaton will build test models this year, according to an Eaton press release. No information is available yet about what models TATSA will produce in Fort Valley nor a specific date for production to begin.
